

Dr F. John Hunt Scholarship [F75880]

Dr Frederick John Hunt has donated funds to The University of Western Australia ('the University') to provide a scholarship to encourage and assist an eligible student from a regional or remote background and experiencing financial hardship to commence a Master of Teaching or Graduate Diploma in Education at the University.

Scholarship conditions	
1. Title:	Dr F. John Hunt Scholarship
2. Governed by:	the University Policy on: Establishment and Award of Scholarships and the conditions that follow (www.governance.uwa.edu.au/policy/UP11/43)
3. Purpose:	to encourage and assist an eligible student from a regional or remote background and experiencing financial hardship to pursue a Master of Teaching or Graduate Diploma in Education at the University
4. Value:	\$5000
5. Duration of scholarship:	a maximum of two semesters, which are normally consecutive
6. Concurrent scholarships:	The scholarship may be held concurrently with any other scholarship or award provided that this is permitted by the conditions of the concurrent scholarship or award.

Eligibility requirements:	<p>(1) To be eligible to apply for a scholarship, an applicant must—</p> <p>(a) be a domestic student;¹</p> <p>(b) a student from a regional or remote area of Australia;²</p> <p>(c) experiencing financial hardship;³</p> <p>(d) be enrolled, or eligible to enrol—</p> <p>(i) full-time unless the selection body is satisfied that there are exceptional circumstances⁴ which preclude full-</p>

	<p>time enrolment; and</p> <p>(ii) in the first 24 points of a Master of Teaching degree course or Graduate Certificate in Education course.</p> <p>(2) To be eligible to take up a scholarship, an awardee must be enrolled—</p> <p>(a) full-time unless the selection body is satisfied that there are exceptional circumstances⁴ which preclude full-time enrolment; and</p> <p>(b) in the first 24 points of a Master of Teaching degree course or Graduate Certificate in Education course.</p> <p>¹ An Australian citizen or permanent resident or holder of a Permanent Humanitarian Visa or a New Zealand citizen.</p> <p>² To be considered for a scholarship based on rural or regional status, students need to prove that they have lived in a rural or remote area. See http://www.scholarships.uwa.edu.au/students/undergrad/rural</p> <p>³ Financial hardship may be demonstrated by an applicant being in receipt of a means-tested Commonwealth income support payment (such as Youth Allowance, Austudy, Abstudy, etc.) or by submitting a statement of financial hardship. See http://www.scholarships.uwa.edu.au/students/undergrad/financial</p> <p>⁴ Exceptional circumstances include, but are not limited to, a medical condition or major family commitments.</p>
<p>8. Selection criterion/criteria:</p>	<p>academic achievement</p>
<p>9. Selection process:</p>	<p>by the selection body having regard to the applicants' academic records</p>
<p>10. Method of payment:</p>	<p>two equal instalments, paid on or after the academic census date in each semester</p>
<p>11. Criteria for continuation:</p>	<p>The recipient must—</p> <p>(a) continue to meet the eligibility requirements;</p> <p>(b) remain enrolled full-time unless there are exceptional circumstances⁴;</p> <p>(c) make satisfactory progress in accordance with the rules for the course for which the scholarship is awarded; and</p> <p>(d) confirm in the manner and by the dates specified by the University, that they continue to meet the eligibility requirements of the scholarship.</p> <p>⁴ Exceptional circumstances include, but are not limited to, a medical condition or major family commitments.</p>

12. Suspension of scholarship:	<p>The scholarship—</p> <p>(a) may only be suspended after the first academic census date following the commencement of the scholarship; and</p> <p>(b) may be suspended for up to two semesters during the tenure of the scholarship subject to approval by the Graduate School of Education.⁵</p> <p>⁵ Students wishing to suspend their course must apply for a period of approved leave from the relevant faculty or board and notify the Faculty Administrative Officer.</p>
13. Application procedure:	<p>Applications are called for by the Graduate School of Education and must be submitted by the advertised closing date.</p>
14. Other conditions:	<p>The scholarship offer must be taken up in the semester for which it is awarded.</p>
15. Publications:	<p>Any thesis, dissertation or other publication resulting from research undertaken by the recipient while in receipt of the Dr F. John Hunt Scholarship must acknowledge the support of the scholarship and carry the University by-line.</p>
